The Antique Tractor Pull takes place toward the end of June. Prior to the actual day of the event there are many things that need to be done. The

first thing is securing the sled and the location of the pull as well as the date. After the date has been set sponsorship letters are mailed to various businesses and individuals in the area in hopes of raising sponsorship money. Sponsorship money is needed to help pay for the cost of the sled, liability insurance, prize money, and advertising. Without the sponsorship money the event would not be possible. A week before the event is when track preparation starts in the hopes of having the best track available for the pullers. During the week of prep there are anywhere from 2-6 alumni members involved. The day of the event requires around 6 alumni members assigned various jobs to pull the event off smoothly. We are also fortunate to get the local FFA chapter involved during the day as they run the concession stand as well as helping as being flagman and hooking the tractors to the sled. Our goal for the pull is to net \$1200-\$1500 in profit after

all expenses are paid. The Antique Tractor Ride takes place on the Friday of the weekend when West Bend holds their 4th of July celebration. The Alumni are very fortunate as to we receive great help from MaxYield Coop, Country Maid Inc. and West Bend Red Power in pulling off this event. All three businesses supply materials and labor during the day of the event. Prior to the day of the event the alumni send out registration letters to previous years riders and collect the registration fee which is \$25. The alumni also line up the route and talk with area towns where the riders will be stopping. Also law enforcement is contacted and made aware of the event. All riders are given a ride t-shirt that is paid for by the alumni. Our goal for the ride is to have roughly 85-100 riders and to clear between \$1200-\$1500 in profit after expenses are paid.
